

# Embedding a Google Presentation Into Drupal

# Creating the Presentation

First, you must have a google account then just visit [docs.google.com](https://docs.google.com)

Then its easier or similar to creating power point presentations.

# Publishing the Presentation

Before Embedding the presentation needs to be published - <http://docs.google.com/support/bin/answer.py?hl=en&answer=69066>

To publish a presentation, follow these steps:

1. Open the presentation you'd like to publish, and click the **Share** button in the upper-right corner of the screen.
2. Click the **Publish/embed** button.
3. Click **Publish document**.
4. After you do this, a URL appears. Simply distribute this link to whomever you'd like to grant access to this presentation.

# Getting the Code

After enabling the share options and code for publishing are provided. Select a size that best fits the presentation and the size of the space it is to be published in.

# Embed into your Node

Now its just cut and past into your content, but make sure you are in plain text or source view when pasting. Also make sure your input format is Full HTML or PHP code

## ▼ Input format

### Filtered HTML

- Web page addresses and e-mail addresses turn into links automatically.
- Allowed HTML tags: `<a>` `<em>` `<strong>` `<cite>` `<code>` `<ul>` `<ol>` `<li>` `<dl>` `<dt>` `<dd>`
- Lines and paragraphs break automatically.

### Full HTML

- Web page addresses and e-mail addresses turn into links automatically.
- Lines and paragraphs break automatically.

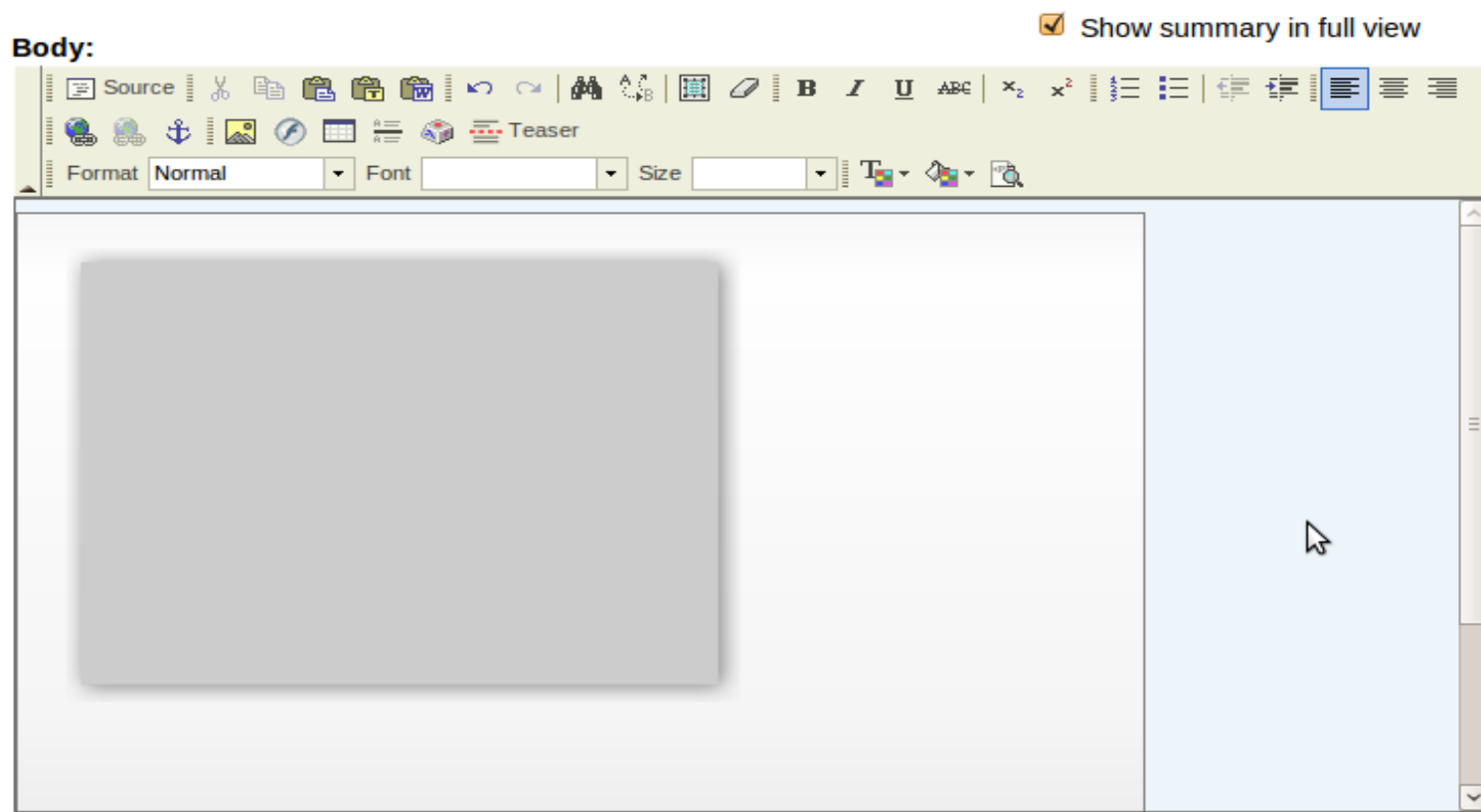
### PHP code

- You may post PHP code. You should include `<?php ?>` tags.

# Did it work?

If you add the code in a wysiwyg such as fckeditor in source mode and then switch back to normal mode an empty presentation should appear. I set the node publishing to not publish so I can test before going live.

# Why do it?

While a presentation type system is quite possible with Drupal it can take quite a bit of work to get something in this sort of format.

- Easy to create demonstrations or presentations
- Embed anywhere in a site or multiple sites
- Updating on Google docs updates wherever embedded

# Drawbacks

The only drawbacks I can see to using this.

- Content within the presentation are not searchable through Drupal and probably not indexed by any Search engines. Make sure you include enough text within the page to cover your content. This should be done for any embedded content such as video. The Presentation can also be exported to PDF or text so it may be advantageous to include the text from the presentation within the page.
- Images in the presentation do not allow for an ALT description. They aren't just for SEO a user with a screenreader would not be able to get a description of the image.
